Up for sale is a 1967 Husqvarna 360. This motorcycle has been historically restored as an authentic replica of the 1967 Husqvarna 360 raced to overall motorcycle victory in the 1967 Mexican 1000 (now the Tecate SCORE Baja 1000). The motorcycle, with a documented history, was restored using original or New Old Stock (NOS) parts throughout. NOS parts include correct Bing Carburetor, air box, expansion chamber exhaust, and rims. Correct added parts include a 1967 BSA center-bolt 4.5 gallon gas tank and BSA headlight. All correct BUFO bolts.

Restoration meticulously performed by John Lefevre, Vintage Husky, San Marcos, California.



The motorcycle has been autographed by Baja 1000 legends and overall winners dating back to 1962 when Dave Ekins set the first time trial record on Highway One with Billy Robertson Jr. in a then record of 39 hours, 56 minutes. Dave Ekins, Rod Hall, Ron Bishop, Malcolm Smith, JN Roberts, Johnny Campbell, Steve Hengeveld, The Weatherman, Bruce Meyers, Larry Minor, are among just a few of the legends of the race who have autographed the bike.

The museum-quality motorcycle is currently on display at the 40th Anniversary Tecate SCORE Baja 1000 Celebration Exhibit at the San Diego Automotive Museum in beautiful Balboa Park, California, about 10 minutes from downtown San Diego.

The 1967 Husqvarna will be auctioned off with The Julia Lynn II, a 2007 Husqvarna TC 510, specially prepared to race in this year's Tecate SCORE Baja 1000. The 2007 Husqvarna successfully finished the race, with the legendary Malcolm Smith leading off in Ensenada, California, followed by his winning partner, JN Roberts.

The two men finished in first place on a motorcycle in that historic first race. This bike still has the famed Baja silt covering it.

The night was electric. A reunion for the ages. Nearly 40 overall winners and legends of the Tecate SCORE Baja 1000 showed up for a night of bench racing, reminiscing, renewing decades-old friendships. The party grew to standing-room only within minutes in the museum, located in historic Balboa Park, home of the world-famous San Diego Zoo. Those who made the trek were not disappointed. Malcolm Smith, JN Roberts, Vic Wilson, Ron Bishop, Ivan "Ironman" Stewart, were among the great legends who greeted the public, signing autographs until their arms dropped.



A big news story unfolded as Malcolm Smith, JN Roberts and Jim Filanc stood in front of a 1967 Husqvarna and a 2007 Husqvarna to announce plans to race in this year's Tecate SCORE Baja 1000. Malcolm Smith will lead off the race and represent the Malcolm Smith Motorsports / Sunstar Racing For Life Offroad Team in the festivities in Tijuana and Ensenada on November 10 and 11, 2007. Several other evening highlights included the autographing by the legends of the beautifully restored replica of the Husqvarna 360 as raced by Malcolm Smith and JN Roberts in that first race 40 years ago. This pristine restoration, along with the 2007 Husqvarna that was ridden by Malcolm and JN in the 2007 race, will be auctioned in January 2008 at the Las Vegas 2008 Vintage Motorcycle Auction with the proceeds to benefit The Malcolm Smith Motorsports Foundation, The Scleroderma Foundation and The Lance Armstrong Foundation. The evening was capped by a group shot of the men who made history. Surrounding the 1967 Husqvarna and

the 2007 Husqvarna, the photo captured this moment for the ages. A special exhibit housing the two bikes through January 31 at the San Diego Auto Museum in Balboa Park, San Diego, California. Yep, the two bikes are already museum pieces – before the auction even happens! By auction date, more than 60,000 people will have previewed the two bikes up close and personal!
